

Newly Appointed: Tahani Nadim Investigates Memory Cultures in Digital Transformation

With Tahani Nadim, Ruhr University Bochum and the College for Social Sciences and Humanities have gained a versed sociologist of science with a strong interdisciplinary profile for a research professorship in digital humanities.

In October 2024, the sociologist of science Tahani Nadim has taken up the research professorship 'Curating Digital Objects of Cultural Knowledge and Memory', which is based at the Institute of Art History of Ruhr University Bochum and is part of the College for Social Sciences and Humanities. She will investigate how digital technologies and digital curating practices affect memory cultures. "Preserving memories and having access to them is essential for people's sense of self, for their right to self-determination and democratic participation", Nadim says.

Eight outstanding international scholars from universities in Israel, Mozambique, Nigeria, South Africa, the United Kingdom, and the USA are joining the College as Senior Fellows for the winter term 2024/2025. Prof. Tahani Nadim

Research Professor 'Curating Digital Objects of Cultural Knowledge and Memory'

We warmly welcome our new research professor Tahani Nadim to the College. She has previously held a junior professorship in social and cultural anthropology at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin in a joint appointment with the Museum für Naturkunde Berlin (MfN). At the MfN she co-lead the 'Centre for the Humanities of Nature', which she co-founded in 2018. She was spokesperson and coordinator (together with Meike Hopp, TU Berlin) of the joint research project 'Museums and society: mapping the social' (2020–2024). She has worked as a programme manager at the Women's Art Library in London, an editor at Black Dog Publishing and a researcher in Goldsmiths Library (Open Access, data models and institutional repositories). She also curated exhibitions, collaborated with artists and runs the experimental research unit 'Bureau for Troubles'.

Tahani Nadim holds a PhD in sociology of science from Goldsmiths, University of London, UK. Her interdisciplinary research has focused on the politics of data, digitisation and collections, specifically in the context of natural history and biodiversity sciences. Her recent work engages with questions of conservation and preservation, silences in/of memory cultures and the role of archives in human-environment relations.



Eight international Senior Fellows are working on intriguing research projects at the College during the winter term, together with tandem partners from Ruhr University Bochum, TU Dortmund University, and the University of Duisburg-Essen.





More than a dozen countries worldwide have adopted a feminist foreign policy to date, although some of them, such as Sweden, later renounced it. In an insightful and lively panel discussion, which took place at the College on 25 June 2024 in cooperation with the Institute for Development and Peace (INEF, University of Duisburg-Essen), experts from government and academia exchanged views and elucidated various facets of feminist foreign and development policies. The recent developments in Germany, in contrast to other countries such as Canada, were at the centre of the discussion.

Decolonial Ecology: Literary and Cultural Representations in the Global South








In the hybrid workshop on 'Decolonial Ecology' on 25 and 26 July 2024, organised by our former Senior Fellow Sule E. Egya, scholars from Nigeria, India, Cameroon, Uganda, Germany, and the Netherlands discussed the entanglement of ecology and coloniality from different perspectives. The presentations shed light on how literary and cultural artists in Africa and Asia represent and interpret indigenous and local ecological practices and perspectives that were marginalised under colonial rule. The participants discussed how these concepts of ecology and interacting with nature can be understood as a counter-discourse to universalised forms of Western knowledge systems and, in view of current environmental crises, could show other ways of shaping the relationship between humans and the environment.


